

Grants, Incentives, Loans, and other resources for Beekeepers/Pollinator Habitat Protection

Beekeepers and those establishing/maintaining pollinator habitats are eligible for some types of public and private sector support through grants, loans, loan guarantees, incentive payments, hive distribution programs, and other resources.

Grants

Apiarists are winning value-added producer (VAP) grants from the USDA. You must produce honey (or other bee-related products) and package it for interstate retail sale. The grant pays for marketing costs only and is completed annually. There are planning grants of up to \$75,000 and working capital grants of up to \$250,000. <u>https://www.rd.usda.gov/programs-services/business-programs/value-added-producer-grants</u>

Grants are available through the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services Agriculture and Forestry Industries Development (AFID) program. Both planning and infrastructure grants may be applied for once a year. The submitter must be your local county/unit of government so if you are interested in AFID grants, you need to start an early conversation with the Economic Development official at your local unit of government.

The list includes three insurance options: the Apiculture Pilot Insurance Program (RI-API), the Whole-Farm Revenue Protection Program, and the Micro-Farm Program. USDA offers six loan programs including the Farm Loan Program which can assist in building overwintering colony storage facilities. Farm Storage Facility Loan program, Microloan program, Emergency loan program, Beginning Farmers and Ranchers Loans, and Non-resource marketing assistance loans-honey program (to help with interim financing at harvest time). USDA grants for which beekeepers have applied include the Local Agricultural Market Program (LAMP), the Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) program, and the Sustainable Agriculture, Research, and Education (SARE) program. It should be noted that these three grants are highly competitive and require significant effort to apply. The USDA-Farm Service Agency has disaster and insurance products that could be beneficial to local beekeepers.
